CHURCH PICNIC

Our church picnic will be on Saturday, August 3, at the beach in Lake Lucerne, Bainbridge, from 1-3 pm. Please bring a potluck dish to share, and your lawn chair. An important highlight of this event will be the baptism of Payton Chute, who is in our confirmation class and wishes to be baptized by immerson. We have a signup sheet to get a rough estimate on numbers attending - sign up at church or let one of the deacons know if you can come. Wear your swimsuit and bring a towel if you would like to swim. We will have games in addition to the picnic and baptism, or you can enjoy the company of good friends!. To get to the beach, it's off route 306 between E. Washington Street to the north, and the 422 exit ramp to the south. Turn into Lake Lucerne at Lakeshore drive at the bottom of the hill and follow it to the left beside the lake, make another left beside a small pond, then turn left into the parking area.

Claridon Community Helps has purchased a commercial refrigerator, same size as old but with more inside room. The old refrigerator is currently in the nursery. We would like to move it to the pantry that runs along the kitchen. Currently the space is occupied by the old freezer used by festivals. Free to good home!!! And we will get rid of the old cups and saucers from our dinnerware set. Also any amount, free to good home. We will put in a plug and move the refrigerator.
