AMY BROWN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Amy Brown was a woman of deep compassion and unwavering generosity. Her life was a testament to service- always ready to lend a hand, she was often heard asking, "Is there anything I can do for you?" Whether donating her time or resources, Amy volunteered at women's shelters, served meals through her church, and offered care and support to families facing illness or hardship. She welcomed everyone with an open heart and rarely turned anyone away. Amy also held a profound respect for education. Though she wasn't able to attend college immediately after high school, she began a long and dedicated career with the Postal Service, where she worked until retirement. Her thirst for learning never waned. Later in life, she enrolled at Kent State University's Geauga Campus, where she pursued creative writing, studied Spanish, and even took a woodshop class. Amy was also a gifted artist - she found joy in sewing, quilting, painting, and was the proud author of two books. Above all, Amy loved worshipping with her church community and especially cherished time spent with the youth. She delighted in watching them grow in faith and walk with God at the center of their lives. MISSIONS COMMITTEE

For the month of May the Missions Committee is supporting the Heartland Conference Disaster Relief Network.

Provide hope and dignity to someone in need.

We all know about the hurricanes, floods and other natural disasters that have hit our neighbors, here in places close to home. Our Heartland Conference collects clean up buckets and hygiene kits to distribute whenever a crisis hits in our area. Their goal is to collect 2,500 buckets and kits this year.

Our Missions Committee has a goal to supply 48 Hygiene Kits towards their efforts. Once we have raised the funds totaling \$336 to purchase 2 packs with the items for 24 kits each, we will have a Kit Packing Party after church to make up the kits and pack them up to be transported back to the Heartland Conference.

The supplies for each kit cost \$7 if purchased this way as compared to estimated totals of \$15 if purchased individually.
