Thanks to all of you who contributed to Red Tulip / Monarch Meadows in September. Our congregation supported the Pasta with a Purpose as well as collecting sheets, towels, and gift cards! And for the group who donated and walked in the Crop Walk – many thanks to you as well.

In October Missions will be supporting a collection for **Neighbors in Need** – Special Mission Offering. Neighbors in Need (NIN) is a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice.

Also, thank you for supporting the Burton Food Pantry during the month of September. We collected 52 bottles of mustard and 200 packages of ramen. Cold and flu season is fast approaching. To that end, we will be collecting Kleenex or similar brands of tissues during the month of October.

HEARTLAND CONFERENCE

On Friday, September 26, 2025 I attended the Heartland Conference Annual Meeting at Ohio Wesleyan University in Delaware, Ohio. It was a spirited gathering with a Keynote from Rev. Dr. Molly T. Marshall on "Who is this Jesus we are following?" along with follow-up group discussions on how we are called to reflect Jesus' way. The music, food and fellowship were wonderful. We learned about the Witness Tree reaching out to Veterans. The 2026 Budget was presented and approved with a deficit of \$205,520 to be funded from the Liquidity Reserves of the Conference. Templed Hills will be auctioned on October 11th with the proceeds to be used primarily for Faith Formation and as a result the Executive Director of Outdoor Ministries position will be eliminated, as well as the part-time Network Coordinator, and a new part-time Faith Formation Coordinator position created. The slate of new Board Members was approved and they were installed. The session ended with information on Cross-Conference collaborations as well as discussions with other denominations, mainly the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) as to ways to focus on sustainability for our Conference and the well-being of theirs. Finance Update

This update for January through September 2025 shows preliminary financial results for the First Congregational Church of Claridon. Total Revenues in the Operating Fund are approximately \$26,000 more than budgeted for the first nine months of the year and include several annual gifts. Revenues for operations do not include gifts restricted for scholarships or the music fund or pass-through gifts that going to other organizations. Total Operating Expenses are about \$5,100 more than budgeted for the nine months, leaving Net Operating Revenue approximately \$20,900 higher than budgeted through September 2025.

The Revenues include funds drawn down from the Endowment of \$9,436, for use in 2025 operations. The Endowment currently shows a balance of \$125,461 and is evaluated by the Endowment Committee each year to determine the amount to be spent. The Endowment Committee meets quarterly and will consider committee requests for upcoming special projects with funds to be drawn from the Endowment in 2026.
