

TREASURER

This Update for January through March 2025 shows financial results for the First Congregational Church of Claridon in the Operating Fund. Total Revenues are approximately \$15,000 more than budgeted for the first quarter of the year and include several annual gifts that will be used to cover Operating Expenses throughout the year. Total Operating Expenses are about \$4,300 less than budgeted for first quarter, leaving Net Operating Revenue approximately \$19,300 higher than budgeted through March 2025.

The Revenues include funds drawn down from the Endowment of \$9,436, for use in 2025 operations. The Endowment currently shows a balance of \$111,607 and is evaluated by the Endowment Committee each year to determine the amount to be spent. The Endowment Committee meets quarterly and will consider committee requests for upcoming special projects with funds to be drawn from the Endowment in 2026.

- Scholarship Funds \$ 39,493
- Pass-Thru Contributions \$ 3,338
- Contingency Fund \$129,412
- Capital & Building Fund \$ 81,711

We, the search Committee, want to express our appreciation for the patience and trust you have placed in us. We are pleased to recommend to you our candidate, Pastor Julie Western, for the called pastor position. What a welcome change it is to be able to hear several sermons and get to know a candidate before extending a call! A Congregational vote, for members will be held on April 27, 2025 following worship.

The association has provided two profiles for us to review. Both are well qualified. One, we interviewed via zoom call and were in the process of scheduling an in person interview when he received an invitation to discern elsewhere. In his own words he is originally an “Atlanta boy” and the thought of lake effect snow was quite intimidating. The other profile was received after we had extended the invitation of candidacy to Pastor Julie.

We are very grateful to Pam Plott acting as liaison to the Living Water Association and to Kellie Ramirez of the Association for all their assistance and support through this process.

To review our steps that led us to this point of confidence in the Spirit's leading:

1. Under the guidance of Rev. Nayiri Karjian, formerly the Association General Minister of the Living Water Association, all church attendees were invited to participate in an exercise to determine who we are, who we hope to become, and what is God's calling on our congregation. This formed the basis of our church profile. The information was compiled by Laura Christian, organized by Pam Plott, reviewed and edited by Brent Eysenbach, and then refined by all three in a final edit, and approved by cabinet.
2. Our vacancy was published on the Living Water Association's website under UCC Ministry Opportunities on June 17, 2024, where our profile could be viewed by potential candidates.
3. We were encouraged when the day after the voting result to call our first candidate was declined by the congregation; we received our first profile and letter of interest through the association. That same day, Pastor Julie Western was interviewed for the bridge pastor position and subsequently hired. What a blessing it has been to get to know her and her husband Dave. We have heard positive comments from many members of the congregation and they have both expressed gratitude for sharing ministry with us.

Please continue to hold Pastor Julie, Dave, and our congregation in prayer. May all that takes place be to the glory of God.
